A. Engineering & Inspection Status Report

Robert Klein, Borough Engineer, stated the ongoing sidewalk program is moving along and should be completed by the end of the year. Roosevelt Avenue is moving along and should be ready to pave soon. He stated the project that is stalled is North Taylor Street, Edward Street, Smith Avenue, MacKay Drive, and O'Neil Street. The work on N. Taylor Street has not started yet and is expected to start Monday. He will receive an updated schedule at the meeting next week. He stated the work should be completed by the end of the year, weather permitting. Mr. Klein stated the time period is up for the first contract, the second contract is moving along and should be completed this year.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Borough Administrator Gallo stated the past week the Borough held its Halloween festivities, Haunted Walk at Cooper's Pond and Trunk or Treat on the Avenue. These events were spearheaded through the Recreation Department, the DPW, and the volunteers and were a big success. The Veteran's Day ceremony will be held on Saturday, November 11th at 11am at Borough Hall. Mr. Gallo stated the Holiday in the Park will be Saturday, December 2nd, 2023. The Fire Department is doing the Hanukkah Run on December 10th and 11th. In addition, they will have the Santa Run on December 16th and the Holiday Light Parade is December 17th, 2023. Mr. Gallo stated a robocall went out this evening stating that effective Monday, November 16th, there will be no over night parking. The DPW, operationally, cannot function with garbage and street cleaning with cars parked on the street through the winter months. They will continue to inform residents on the website, social media, and via telephone. The Council will have to reevaluate this for other times of the year and how to proceed.
